Grants to support rural Night-Time Economy

SIX pubs or venues across the county received Night-Time Economy Support following successful applications to the €4 million scheme.

Rural applications account for over half of those awarded funding, and Minister for Tourism, Culture, Arts, Gaeltacht, Sport and Media, Catherine Martin, estimates that thousands of performance employment days will be generated as a direct result.

The successful Cavan applicants include The Lavey Inn; The Widow's Bar in Belturbet; The Cottage Market, which is held at Lizzy Buggies in Ballyconnell, Gartlan's in Kingscourt; Clonandra Cottages, Redhills; and Lee's Public House, Ballyconnell.

The funding is to assist in providing off-peak entertainment.

A total of 433 organisations

were offered funding and applications were received from a wide range of venues including pubs, nightclubs, cafés, theatres, arts centres, galleries, museums and retail outlets.

The scheme included a specific strand of funding for unlicensed premises such as cafés, dry bars and other suitable venues to support diversification and inclusivity in our Night-Time Economy.

Elsewhere across the region, Leitrim had two successful applications, as did Longford, Meath had eight, and Monaghan five.

The five successful Monaghan applications included Brian Adamson's Bar; the Westerna Arms Hotel; the Creighton Hotel in Clones; Wild Thyme Restaurant; and the Four Seasons Hotel.

Reacting to the announce-

ment last week, Minister Martin said: "A vibrant, diverse and inclusive night-time economy is important for our towns and cities, it boosts the local economy, makes our towns and cities more attractive places to visit and to live in. There has been a great reaction from the night-time sector to this pilot scheme."

She said it was also "extremely important" to ensure a balance between alcohol and alcohol-free activities to cater for a wider demographic.

The Minister continued: "I am currently considering the development of further initiatives and we will continue to work with key stakeholders in the Night-Time Economy to examine other opportunities to open up existing venues to more Night-Time Economy activity."
