Concra Wood Golf and Country Club is a mere 20 minute drive from Castle Leslie Estate and is an 18 hole Champonship Golf Course. Brehon Brew House

Monaghan's microbrewery - Brehon Brewhouse is housed on the family farm amongst the rolling drumlins of County Monaghan, just a few miles from the birthplace of Patrick Kavanagh, the inspiration for their India Pale Ale -Stony Grey Soil IPA. Brehon Brewhouse creates distinct beers which are brewed with care and affection. Here you can enjoy brewery tours, hear the story of the McMahon family, see the famine cottage, and finish the visit in the tasting room - 'The Cottage' - the McMahon family homestead. Small group bookings of 2-10 people can be accommodated on Thursday and Saturday at 12 noon. Larger groups can be arranged by booking during office hours Monday-Friday from 9am-5pm.

The Cassandra Hand Folk and Famine Centre

The Cassandra Hand Folk and Famine Centre is located in the old Round Tower School situated in the historic town of Clones, Co. Monaghan, and was built in 1859 by Cassandra Hand with proceeds from Clones Lace, Clones Lace was a famine relief initiative introduced by Cassandra after she arrived in Clones in 1847 during the worst years of the Great Famine. With the beautiful image of Clones Round Tower visible through the classroom windows to the front, there mains of Clones Abbey on one side and the remains of a Norman Motte and Bailey on the other, the Folk and Famine Centre is centrally located as a stopping point to explore the town. An exhibition about the Famine in Clones is on permanent display and is being continually added to. Open by appointment only during the winter months, the centre caters to visitors from home and abroad, and offers guided walks of the town, exhibitions, room hire, talks, music nights, school visits and so much more.

St. Peter's Tin Church

Constructed of tin. St. Peter's Tin Church Laragh is one of a kind in Co. Monaghan and unique on the island of Ireland for its quirky design and carefully considered features. St. Peter's of historic Laragh Village is literally built on a rock, in a beautiful woodland setting amongst the ferns and ivy. It is anecdotally said that its Swiss-Gothic hybrid style was applied by the mill owner and his wife following their honeymoon in Switzerland - its site carefully chosen to mimic that found in the Swiss Alps. St. Peter's Tin Church Laragh was deconsecrated in the 1950s, was restored by the local community and proudly reopened in 2014. It is a very popular venue for intimate music recitals, lunchtime dramas. wedding photography, trad sessions, vintage displays, touring choral group performances, harvest banquets etc. Aside from scheduled events the Tin Church attracts a steady flow of visitors to this very rural area in Co. Monaghan.

The Tin Church is open to the public and free to visit 7 days per week from 10am-6pm (including Bank Holidays).

Walking

Sliabh Beagh is an area of upland heathland, blanket bog and outstanding natural beauty that transcends counties Monaghan, Fermanagh and Tyrone. There are several walking routes in the Sliabh Beagh area. These include the Sliabh Beagh Way, a 46km long distance walk, marked from St. Patrick's Chair & Well in Co. Tyrone, entering Co. Monaghan at Lough More, going over Bragan Mountain, carrying on through the lower moorland behind Knockatallon and into Fermanagh via Mullaghfad, Jenkin Carnmore/Carnrock, winding its way through Tully Forest and aptly ending at Donagh. There are also 36 looped walks throughout the Sliabh Beagh region, all of which are way[1]marked and vary in length from 4km - 15km. Sliabh Beagh Adventures is an outdoor adventure centre based in Knockatallon Village, Co. Monaghan - the gateway to Sliabh Beagh and offers bike hire to visitors, allowing them to explore the region on two wheels. They also offer battle and target archery and various team games and team building exercises for groups. Guided walks and cycling tours can also be organised.

Walking

There are a variety of exceptional walks, from short jaunts to long leisurely strolls. Wander throughout the Estate grounds and around the village of Glaslough. Breath in the fresh country air and stunning scenery as you walk throughout the beautiful landscape of our estate. With several walks mapped out, all of which containing stunning scenery, Castle Leslie Estate has something for everyone.

Falconry

Experience a unique insight into the noble and ancient art of Falconry which offers a stimulating, unique, and memorable experience. The majestic, beautiful birds are captive bred both in Ireland and abroad. They include different species of falcons, hawks, owls, and the magnificent golden eagle. We have four different packages which you can choose from, and bookings can be made 72 hours in advance.



Clay Target Shooting

Experience the thrill of Clay Target Shooting at Clontibret Shooting Centre, Clontibret, Co Monaghan (only a 15 minute drive from Castle Leslie Estate). Glenn Ross is an ICPSA accredited Safety Officer and Coach and recognized by An Garda Siochana to carry out gun competency training. He has represented Ireland 11 times at Home International level and once at the World Cup in Rome 2005. He has won the Ulster Open twice and Irish Grand Prix twice in recent years and has 11 Ulster Inter-Provincial badges, 10 of which are winning badges.

Archery

Fishing

The Leslie family have been the custodians of the stunning 'Glaslough' or Green Lake for generations. The lake is brimming with monster pike, and fishermen widely consider it to be one of Ireland's best-preserved loughs. In fact, in 1991 a fisherman reeled in a catch weighing 38lb 9oz (17.5kg) and broke Ireland's 18 year record. Fishing is charged per rod (person) per day and includes the use of a boat.

Boating

Enjoy a morning or afternoon boating on our glistening Glaslough Lake or 'Green Lake'. While away the hours by relaxing on one of our boats and admire the stunning scenery all around you including our ancient woodlands, gardens and of course our beautiful Castle.




